2020 thanksgiving theme - Pastoral Council and Finance Committee

As many would know, each parish bulletin this year we've been giving thanks for some element of service that makes the presence and mission of the parish possible. This week, I'd like to suggest a thanksgiving for those parishioners who have formed our Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Committee.

The Pastoral Council has very keenly paralleled some of our potential parish priorities with the wisdom and yearnings that have been expressed through the Australian Church Plenary Process. Shortly they'll be encouraging some next involvements of others' gifts too. And the finance committee has exercised a stewardship of care for parish funding that was heading worryingly backwards when Fr Mick arrived in the parish and asked this committee on board to assist. We are still not in a financial position to meet typical core parish operating needs, such as a sacramental coordinator, caretaking, youth program or any role beyond our stretched three days of secretarial allocation. BUT it's good news, at least, that the auditor's feedback recently received from the diocese reported our year as 'net equal'. And that's after paying for some of the maintenance issues that have been on hold. And as part of our 'net equal' position, we also gave to our outreach priorities through the diocese's Foundation that supports the deaf, Catholic Care services and seminarians – and to Caritas, St Vincent de Paul and Catholic Mission.

These two groups, the Pastoral Council and Finance Committee, have shared some meetings of review and reflection regarding where we are as a parish and what the possibilities ahead might be. As a result, in the period ahead this year, these groups will be re-formed, along with a couple of other groups, to help coordinate what is hoped to be a blessing for the parish of some extra people finding avenues to enjoy some involvement. Hopefully that will also include a number of people who are newer to the parish.

Starting next week, we can look forward to these parish committee members inviting others to consider some possibilities of enjoyable, shared involvement. In the meantime, let's give thanks for these keen people who continue to give of their faith and energy to care for a number of priorities for our parish's continuing life here in Emu Plains.
