Dear friends, Confirmation – and a strange term

Special thoughts this week for our parish children celebrating Confirmation. The Minister of Confirmation will be Fr Chris de Souza. Fr. Chris is the parish priest of Harris Park and is also appointed to a role known as 'vicar general'. For those who don't know that strange sounding term, the term 'vicar' means to represent or to act in someone's place. The bishop of every diocese appoints a priest as 'vicar general' which means his 'main representative' to share his responsibilities. So, we can look forward to welcoming Fr Chris de Souza, as vicar general, for Confirmation. Co-incidentally of course, Bishop Vincent is with us for the regular parish Mass on Saturday evening of this weekend. He likes to move around the diocese and blend in with the normal activity of people's lives and faith rather than only focus on the 'special event' agenda that so easily crams out a bishop's schedule. Thanks to Bishop Vincent for this gesture of ordinary life.

Stories, hopes and experiences of parents

For each of the three sacraments celebrated with groups of young people this year (Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation) I've valued the chance to hear from the parents. As we know, it's only a very small minority of those parents and children who have a participation in sacramental life here in the parish as a regular part of their lives. Whilst that's a trend in most places, I can say that since being at Emu Plains just this year I've noticed that this minority here in our parish is guite a bit smaller than I've seen or see elsewhere. Our starting point in knowing why or responding to this could be a number of approaches and the parish pastoral council will be making it a priority agenda item. How can we keep growing meaningful connections for the journey of life and faith – for the sacramental life – for enjoyable faith community belonging?

I don't claim to know the answers to these questions. My own first step with the sacramental group parents this year has been guite simply to ask and hear something of their experiences and stories, their perceptions and hopes. And I can now say that I am moved by the yearning, the love and the faith of these parents – including many who for whatever reason don't connect to parish sacramental life. I'm moved by their ongoing openness to God. I'm moved by the presence of God's goodness in and through them. And I'm moved to now have a very long list of their comments that I've typed up (12 jam-packed typed pages) in response to various faith and life questions from which I've received their written responses. I hope these responses can also help to serve us as a parish; help us to ask good guestions and share faith-filled discernment as to how we might keep striving to respond as a parish for God and God's people in the particular challenges and opportunities of today.
