This weekend we will highlight the inspiring efforts of the organisation and work known as '*Catholic Mission*'. Official branches of *Catholic Mission* exist across the world. The Australian branch has its base in North Sydney with a greatly dedicated team. The idea of this official organisation of our Church is that it is <u>us</u>, extended.

WHY THE NAME?

The organisation and work is called *Catholic Mission* for at least two important reasons:

1. because the word *Catholic* means *universal* - or - *for all* – and so it reaches to every corner and culture. And 2. it is named *Catholic Mission* because it is OURS... For any of us to say yes to following Christ means by definition to be missionary. It means to be someone who says yes to being sent in various ways to live and share the Gospel. Our faith might send us across the street, across the community, across the workplace or across the world. *Catholic Mission* is an expression and extension of our missionary work in ways that would be hard for any one, or group or parish to organise alone. For example, our participation in *Catholic Mission* this year, along with all our neighbouring parishes, will support a remarkable project for children in Ghana. So in a nutshell, this organisation and work is called *Catholic Mission* because it is for all - and because it is us.

THE GHANA PROJECT

In parts of Ghana, a child born with a defect is seen as a 'spirit child' — not in a good sense of spirit but because it is thought to have a bad omen. That child might be rejected by the community, even by the family and his/her life taken! Sister Stan Therese Mumumi started the. Nazareth Home for God's Children there in Ghana — a powerful work of belonging and nurturing that allows such children to literally be saved. It gives them belonging, safety, education and development towards living a full life. Bishop Vincent Sowah Boi-Nah of Yendi, Ghana, on behalf of his community, is committed to Sr Stan's life-saving work and to influencing the change of thinking and belief needed to overcome this dark danger.

We give special thanks to God this weekend for Sr Stan. May we also give thanks for the way we can be so powerfully present, even though not personally physically, through *Catholic Mission*, the extension of our missionary hands and hearts.
