### **End of liturgical year**

As usual this weekend, with the Feast of Christ the King, we finish the liturgical year, ready for the next one to begin with next weekend's 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent. For the benefit of anyone who might not realise, there is a three year cycle of readings and prayers for the Sundays of the year; Year A, Year B and Year C. We're just finishing <u>Year C</u> (which features the Gospel of Luke on most of its weekends) and next week will begin Year A (which will mostly feature the Gospel of Matthew). Year A will go through until November 2020.

### **Today's Feast of Christ the King**

Our Catholic faith teaches that we, as baptised people, share in Christ's mission as king. Here's a formal line from the Catechism of the Catholic Church that says this:

The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to their own vocation, in Christ's mission as priest, prophet, and king (Paragraph 1546).

# How is it that we are 'king'?

This aspect of Christian identity – Christ's mission as king – can be understood in some key ways. Even though it's a male term, it includes men and women in this identity. Getting behind the word, the realm of a king/royal included leadership over land, assets and various resources and activities in the world. To say today that Christians share this aspect of Christ's mission; this aspect of king; says that Christians are called to leadership over land, assets and various resources and activities in the world – and that they are called to such leadership specifically and intentionally with the mind and heart of Christ. Putting it in these terms, there are endless possibilities for how we apply this aspect of Christian identity.

### Another aspect of our kingly/royal identity

The king or royal also had the oversight of mercy in a royal realm. They had the power to grant pardon and to provide for the welfare and care of people under their jurisdiction. For baptised Christians, these aspects of being channels of mercy and channels of care are also very significant applications of the kingly mission of Christ in which the baptised faithful share. Exercising our kingly mission, we are called to be leaders in mercy and care in the world. Hence, what a powerful potential it holds to be identified in the kingly mission of Christ.

# The faithful also as prophet and priest

Notice the earlier Catechism reference also says that the faithful share in Christ's mission as prophet and priest. This can surprise some people, especially the priest part! It often hasn't been a strong focus because we've mainly focussed on the ordained priesthood. **Continued** -
