PREPARATION FOR THE XVI SYNOD OF BISHOPS.

This Sunday 17th October 2021, dioceses around the world will launch local preparations for this synod. The Synod, themed "For a synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission" was solemnly opened in Rome last week by Pope Francis.

This Sunday at 10am, Bishop Vincent will be celebrating a livestreamed Mass at St Nicholas of Myra Parish, Penrith to mark the opening of the Synod of Bishops in the Diocese of Parramatta. This Mass will be broadcast on the St Nicholas of Myra Facebook page

Prayer for the Synod

As we embrace this Synodal Process, this prayer invites The Holy Spirit to be at work in us so that we may be a community and a people of grace.

We stand before you, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time in the communion of the Father and the Son forever and ever. Amen.

This prayer can be used throughout the duration of the Synodal Process from October 2021-2023.



MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY. "The Rosary is the most beautiful and the richest of all **prayers to the Mediatrix of all grace**; It is the prayer that touches most the heart of the Mother of God. Say it each day!" "Amidst all prayers, the Rosary is the most beautiful, the richest in graces, and the one that most pleases the Most Holy Virgin." **Pope Francis**

The feast was introduced by **Pope St. Pius V** (1504-1572) in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The pope attributed more to the "arms" of the Rosary than the power of cannons and the valor of the soldiers who fought there. St. Padre Pio:

Today we face unprecedented challenges on every front. The evils of "this present darkness" weigh heavy against us. Perhaps this is what makes the advice of St. Padre Pio, a holy man from our own age, so valuable and insightful. "Some people are so foolish that they think they can go through life without the help of the Blessed Mother. Love the Madonna and pray the rosary, for her rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today. All graces given by God pass through the Blessed Mother." St. Padre Pio.
