Fifth Sunday of Easter – Year C

Welcome for the celebration of the Word and the Eucharist.

Entrance Antiphon. Cf. Ps 97:1-2

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 14:21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

I spent a week on deployment in Murwillumbah with the Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy. Murwillumbah was one of many towns in the Northern Rivers severely effected in the recent floods. I worked mostly on my own. The floods affected a large area and Chaplaincy was really stretched trying to meet this almost unprecedented demand.

There are many horrific stories I could relate about this week, about people trapped making what they thought was their last phone call to their loved ones. Stories about husbands and wives sitting on their roof in the dark listening to their live stock drowning and thinking they too were about to drown. But there's one story I would like to share. I was asked to talk with a lady who was too distraught to even come into the Centre. I sat with her in the park opposite. We must have talked for an hour. She told me she had just come from a funeral for her friend who had drowned. He had been drowned while trying to cross a river to get urgent medical supplies for his wife. She said he was a very fit young man, however the police said it looked like he'd been hit by a log and washed off the bridge. At the end of our conversation she asked: Why do you do this, why put yourself through this? I have no idea where the answer came from but I found myself saying: You are Christ to me. Then I repeated to her that beautiful line from the Closing Prayer for Christian Medation: "To serve all who come and receive them as Christ himself". She said you are a wonderful man. To which I replied as always: "I'm just the arms and legs."

My beautiful wife Kaye has taken me away for a 'reset break' to Port Douglas in Far North Queensland. I've snorkeled on the Outer Great Barrier Reef and walked in the Daintree Rainforest. Our God is a God of absolute beauty. And I see that beauty everywhere even in the face of that woman in that park in Murwillumbah.
