# Second Reading Rom 5:6-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

We have been reconciled to God through the death of his Son; we are saved by his life.

We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Parish Event 24<sup>th</sup> June: I refer to what Fr Michael wrote in his letter to the Parish on the first weekend of June (see Bulletin online), which explained delays in and demonstrated recent action taken by the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) in relation to the needs of the Parish. This action was based on Meetings of the PPC in February and May this year. Importantly, the outcome of the May Meeting included action based on and arising from discussions that parishioners took part in during 2020 around the time of and connected with the Australian Plenary Council consultations.

Bishop Vincent has called for a Synod. A synod is a community gathering where we can come together to listen to each other and suggest the way forward for the benefit of all of us. People are asked to come together and discuss what our faith means to them and share their experiences. What comes out of these discussions will then be forwarded to the Diocese in an attempt to make changes that suit our Catholic community in these modern times. If we are to move forward and be part of the community, we need to come together as a community and identify issues to be addressed. I encourage you to join us on 24 June at 4pm in the OLOW Parish Hall.
