Letter from Fr Michael:

Dear Parishioners,

Since my appointment to be the Parish Priest in this lovely Parish on 1st September 2021, I am thankful to all the support I have received from all of you. When I took over the role of the Parish Priest in this Parish it was my intention to re-constitute the Pastoral and Financial committees. The process has been a little slow because of the effect of the Covid-19 Pandemic, as you know, my appointment was in the middle of Covid.

In Lieu of this a small sub-committee has been put in place in preparation for this significant occasion for our Parish.
