**First Reading** Proverbs 8:22-31 A reading from the book of Proverbs

*Wisdom was born before the earth was made.* The Wisdom of God cries aloud:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries - and the waters will not invade the shore when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

# **Trinity Sunday Reflection**

Trinity Sunday is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Pentecost. It revolves around the Christian belief of the divine Trinity: the **THREE** forms of God, namely the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The number **THREE** is one of the most important numbers throughout the Bible. There are **THREE** gifts from the Magi: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Jesus prayed **THREE** times before being arrested, he was put at the cross at the **THIRD** hour of the day and died at the ninth hour which is **THREE** pm. The number **THREE** is the number of eternal life, as Jesus was resurrected after THREE days of being dead. There were THREE disciples in Jesus' "inner circle" -Peter, James, and John – who had many special blessings, but especially the blessing of seeing Jesus glorified on the Mount of Transfiguration. God himself is described in THREE dimensions, "which is, and which was, and which is to come" (Revelation 1:4).

So, this Trinity Sunday let us remember **THREE** things; he is a God who cares for us, who loves us and knows us each by name and he is waiting for us when our earthly journey is done.
