So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

It seems that no one has returned to give thanks to God except this foreigner.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'

Catholic Care Emergency Food Drive: The pantry items that OLOW so generously donates is an important part of the service Catholic Care offers at Springwood. The clientele is mostly middle-aged to senior in years and close to 50/50 male and female. There are several rough sleepers who go in each week to pick up things like 2-minute noodles, pasta, tuna and beans etc. The remaining clients who rely on the Catholic Care small pantry are vulnerable seniors, some with mental health concerns and or physical disabilities. Last month 228 people came for help with 115 of these requiring food and toiletries.

In terms of the most frequently asked for items, there is a need for more pasta sauces or crushed tomatoes, as they receive plenty of packs of pasta but not enough to go with them. There are also requests for tinned fruit and coffee. Our monthly food drive will take place next weekend 18/19 October.

Please note Catholic Care are unable to accept any goods that have passed the 'use by' date. Thank you for your very generous response
